One of the outcomes of this review was agreement that all staff should be required to have basic DBS checks (in addition to the existing requirement for anyone working with children and youth to have an enhanced DBS). All stewards, PCC, life group leaders, worship and prayer ministry team members should be asked to take the CofE safeguarding course.

The church BBQ on 7 July was enjoyed by all; many thanks to everyone who helped make it happen, and particular thanks to the butcher on Walcot Street for great service and Keith Stuffins for overall supervision!
